Join Us For Our Winter Conference

Welcome to the 2005 Dakota Territory Buffalo Association Winter Conference and Black Hills Buffalo Classic Show and Sale. The events will take place beginning on Friday, January 28 and end with the live animal auction on Sunday, January 30. The conference will take place in the Rushmore Plaza Holiday Inn and the show and sale will be held in the adjacent Rushmore Plaza Civic Center in Rapid City, SD.

The weekend's activities begin on Friday afternoon with the Ladies Spa Day at Mystique Edge in downtown Rapid City. Friday evening, everyone is invited to attend the social at Prairie Edge Trading Co. and Galleries, also in downtown Rapid City, just minutes from the host hotel. This social offers attendees the opportunity to not only sample great food and visit with other producers, but to do some shopping as well. The Prairie Edge store is open for shopping during the social and the atmosphere of the entire evening has made this a very popular event.

On Saturday, the conference gets underway with a general membership meeting in the morning where the association's business and future planning will take place. The late morning will be devoted to a planning session for the 2007 International Bison Conference. Rapid City was selected as the host site for this gathering and the DTBA will be helping to host the event. This will be a huge opportunity for the Rapid City area and for our members, so lots of attention will be giving to planning this event of a lifetime. You will want to make sure and be a part of this session.

After the lunch break, attention will turn toward learning about the National Bison Association's Source Verification Program and the National Animal ID program. Lance and Tahma Kuck will present the Source Verification information, while our state veterinarian, Dr. Sam Holland, will talk about the national program. This will be an excellent opportunity for attendees to ask questions and find out more about these programs and how to participate. There will be a mandatory identification program for livestock in the very near future, so this information will be pertinent to anyone in the livestock industry.

Our final session of the afternoon will feature Dr. James Derr from Texas A & M University speaking on buffalo genetics. Dr. Derr is with the department of Veterinary Pathobiology and he is the director of the DNA Technologies Lab at the university. He has been involved in some research with buffalo DNA and he will be on hand to tell us about what they are doing and what they have discovered to date.

The business meeting will then wrap up with the board of directors election being the last business of the day.

After a short break in the activities, the evening banquet and awards ceremony will get underway with a Fun Auction to follow. This year will feature some special entertainment prior to the Fun Auction. For those of you who were entertained by the board of directors last year, rest easy. They will not be doing a repeat performance!

While conference attendees are being educated and entertained, some serious competition will be taking place. The 2005 Black Hills Buffalo Classic Show and Sale is promising to be one of the best industry events of the year. When the judging is finished, the award winners will be announced during the Saturday evening banquet. Winners of the Reality Based Carcass Class will also be announced during the banquet.

On Sunday, the morning gets underway with judge's comments and the Black Hills Buffalo Classic Sale begins at 9 a.m. in the arena of the Rushmore Plaza Civic Center. The sale is open to the public with no admission fee charged.

We hope you will make plans to join us in Rapid City for the 2005 Winter Conference and Black Hills Buffalo Classic Show and Sale.

**Minutes of the DTBA Board Meeting
November 20, 2004 • Rapid City, SD**

President Scott Peterson called the meeting to order. Board members present were Jacki Limpert, Jud Seaman, and Rick Knobe. Executive Director, Karen Conley was also present.

The minutes from the July 26, 2004 teleconference were read and Seaman made a motion to accept them. Knobe seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Limpert presented the treasurer's report for the association. After reviewing, Knobe made a motion to accept the treasurer's report as presented. Seaman seconded the motion. Motion carried. Limpert will work on several revisions to the report for the next meeting.

The 2005 Black Hills Buffalo Classic Show and Sale was discussed. The issue of sheep in the same area as the buffalo was discussed. Seaman and Conley met with the Black Hills Stock Show Sheepdog committee and they were very understanding of our need to keep the sheep away from the buffalo during our show. The committee gave permission for our Sale Chairman, Steve Sutton, to pen the sheep in a designated area away from any buffalo that might be remaining following our auction. During the auction, the DTBA will encourage all buyers to load out as soon as possible to avoid any potential problems.

Trophy sponsorships were gone over. Several board members asked if we should downsize our trophies or offer something less expensive, as sponsorships are hard to come by. Other board members felt the bronze trophies are a draw for consignors. It was decided to bring the topic up to the members at the January consignors and general membership meetings and get feedback at that time.

A tentative agenda was discussed for the 2005 conference. We will have speakers on Animal Identification and the NBA's

Bull Calves: 18 head sold. Average weight was 408 pounds. Average price was \$446 per head or \$1.09 per pound.
Yearling Bulls: 6 head sold. Average weight was 728 pounds. Average price was \$817 per head or \$1.12 per pound.
Two Year Old Bulls: 5 head sold. Average weight was 1,059 pounds. Average price was \$925 per head or \$.87 per pound.
Heifer Calves: 45 head sold. Average weight was 395 pounds. Average price was \$383 per head or \$.97 per pound.
Bred Cows: 4 head sold. Average weight was 920 pounds. Average price was \$800 per head or \$.87 per pound.

Source Verification program. Other speaker ideas were brought up but no final decisions were made. With our auction beginning so early on Sunday morning, the board agreed that we will have Judge's comments out in the pen that morning and will also provide a written synopsis of the judge's comments for better review by consignors and buyers.

Limpert has been working to line up a sponsor for the ear tags for the show and is hopeful that Cammack Ranch Supply will come through on that.

Our Welcoming Reception on Friday night will again be hosted at Prairie Edge in downtown Rapid City. Duane Lammers is setting it up and Conley will work with him to set times and coordinate numbers of attendees.

We will have two vacancies on the board of directors in January. Peterson's term will be finished and he is not eligible to run again. Knobe's term will expire and although he is eligible to run again, he has declined to do so for personal reasons. All directors will work on cultivating potential candidates for the two vacancies.

Peterson filled in the board regarding the upcoming consignment auction in St. Onge. Plans are on track for the auction and Peterson is hopeful that we will have a good number of animals to sell and buyers in the seats. Sale flyers for both the St. Onge and Yankton sales were mailed out with newsletters to 300 non-DTBA members as well as all the current membership. Response for the St. Onge sale has been good so far, but Yankton has not.

There being no further business, Knobe made a motion to adjourn and Seaman seconded it. Meeting adjourned.

Minutes of the DTBA Board Meeting

December 20, 2004 • Telephone Conference

President Scott Peterson called the meeting to order. Board members present were Lorene Bender, Steve Schmitz, Jacki Limpert, Jud Seaman and Executive Director, Karen Conley.

The minutes from the November 20, 2004 board meeting were reviewed and accepted by all board members. An unofficial review of the financials was made and acknowledged by all board members. President Peterson asked Limpert to have the year-end report for 2004 prepared and sent to all board members for review no later than January 15, 2005.

The discussion moved into the upcoming Black Hills Buffalo Classic Show and Sale. Conley presented information on the number of animals entered in the show and the need for a few additional entries in the new pen classes. Numbers are up from the 2004 event and all consignors have been notified about their entries. Ear tags have been secured and will mail the week of December 27 and Conley will notify consignors when their tags are in the mail. The board discussed the need for a chute on the grounds and we will have one secured prior to the show.

The Reality-Based Carcass Class is scheduled for January 3, 2005. The bull class is currently full, but the heifers are still short about six head. Conley will continue to work to fill the remaining spots. There was some discussion about the new weight minimums being too high for the heifers, thereby turning away consignors. However, the board agreed that this is a premier event and will maintain the weight minimums to ensure the best possible animals are being delivered for the contest.

Limpert brought up the need to fill all the carcass class spots in order to cover the prize money. She suggested that for 2006 we should base the award money on the number of entries in each class. In essence, the award money would be jackpotted back to the consignors, with more entries equaling a larger cash prize. This idea will be discussed further at the membership meeting in January.

Sponsorships are coming along. Board members have done a good job of lining up new business sponsors, thereby taking some of the pressure off DTBA members to sponsor items. There are still sponsorships to fill at this time. Conley and Limpert are working to secure the remaining sponsorships. All board members were encouraged to try and garner several more business sponsorships.

The live animal auction will begin at 9 a.m. on Sunday, January 30. This will cause some time constraints with Judge's Comments. We will be typing them up and copying them for our buyer's/consignor's use. Conley will contact the judges to confirm and go over this change with them to ensure that they under-

stand how this will work.

The Winter Conference schedule was discussed, with Limpert and Conley running through the tentative agenda to date. On Friday, there will be a board meeting, the Ladies Spa Day, a consignor's meeting and the social at Prairie Edge. On Saturday, we will conduct our general membership meeting, elections and International Bison Conference planning in the morning. The afternoon will be reserved for speakers. There will be a few vendors in the hotel foyer. Conley will contact several more, with a limit of five outside vendors being allowed.

The board has been contacting potential candidates for the 2005 elections. We will have two vacancies this year. Efforts will continue to secure candidates for these positions.

Peterson reviewed the consignment auction at St. Onge in early December. The sale was successful and saw strong prices with lots of buyers on hand. The auction barn has indicated they would be interested in doing more auctions. The eastern sale in Yankton was cancelled due to lack of entries. These consignment auctions will be discussed at the general membership meeting before plans are made for any future auctions.

The National Bison Association conference in January was mentioned. Many of the board will be in attendance, with emphasis placed on the state/regional association meeting on Thursday morning.

Conley updated the board with progress on obtaining a new insurance policy. She has been working with our insurance carrier to update our policy to better reflect the needs of the association. The goal is to have the policy in place prior to our winter conference.

Fund raising ideas were discussed. We have a set of Tony Chytka bronze bookends that we can use for a raffle. Conley will work on securing two or three other items for a new raffle. The board would like to have this done and ready to begin at the winter conference. Bender suggested a prize consisting of the DTBA providing a room for two nights at the NBA host hotel for the 2006 NBA conference. All agreed this would be an excellent idea. Conley and Peterson will contact the NBA to see if they would be willing to offer complimentary conference registration to the winner.

There being no further business, Seaman made the motion to adjourn the meeting. Schmitz seconded the motion. Meeting adjourned.

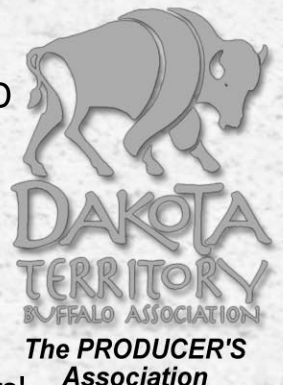
