For those of you who may not know where our show/sale venue is, here's the scoop!

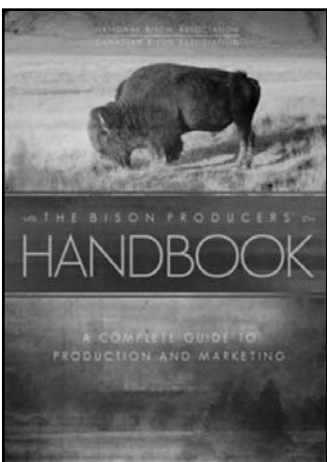

Bison Exhibit Grand Opening

The bison exhibit will be having the grand opening on Feb. 5, 2010 in the Museum of Geology at South Dakota School of Mines and Technology. The exhibit will include a bison bison bison (Fredrick), a bison antiquus, a bison crassicornis (Kent), a bison latifrons (Harlan), and a bison priscus.

Along with these skulls being presented, the literature associated will be informing the viewer the history of bison, both paleontologically speaking and historically to North America.

What is seen with the evolution of bison is that with the first, priscus, is that bison is a larger version of today's bison, however is not the largest. The next species, latifrons, is the largest bison to ever exist. With a horn span over nine feet. With environmental changes occurring with the rapid climate dynamics, the bison evolves into a smaller sized bison, the crassicornis. The demise of the great continental glaciers prompted bison yet again to adapt smaller as food supply evolved into more grasses, the "ancient bison" bison antiquus. Antiquus would have had a horn span of just over two feet but no bigger than 3 feet; still bigger than today's bison that we are all familiar with. Eventually antiquus evolves into today's bison bison bison (Plains Bison).

I do not have a bison bison athabasca (Woods Bison) skull, or a bison bonasus (European Bison or Wisent) skull available for display, but perhaps with time I will acquire these items and perhaps expand this project to show the sexual dimorphism by incorporating the female skull of each of the seven species.
