Girlz Gone Wild Bred Heifer Challenge is Underway!

We are excited to report that the Girlz Gone Wild Bred Heifer Challenge is off to a fantastic start! Thanks to the incredible support of Kevin Leier and Heartland Bison Ranch, along with our dedicated consignors, this year's contest is already shaping up to be something special.

We're proud to have 33 heifers from 11 producers participating in this year's event. Representing a broad regional reach, our consignors hail from North and South Dakota, Nebraska, and even the Southern U.S., giving this contest strong representation across our membership.

The heifers were delivered to Heartland Bison Ranch on April 15th. After settling in, they were worked, weighed, and turned out to grass. They will be bred to a Heartland Bison bull—an impressive animal and former DTBA Young Guns Performance Bull Contest winner—making this group of heifers truly elite.

This year, we're introducing new judging criteria, with the competition divided into three equal categories:

- End Weight (33%)
- ADG on Grass (33%)
- Live Judging for Conformation (33%)

In early 2026, the heifers will be relocated to Cammack Buffalo Ranch for the final leg of the contest. They'll be available for viewing during our 30th Anniversary Celebration, February 6–7, 2026, at The Lodge at Deadwood. Winners will be announced, and the heifers will be offered for sale on February 7th.

We're thrilled to showcase this special group during such a milestone event. A heartfelt thank you goes out to Kevin Leier, Heartland Bison Ranch, and all of our courageous and committed consignors. We couldn't do it without you!
